Since at least the psychedelic 1960s, we've asked ourselves: was it all a dream—or the result of mind-altering plants and fungi? Explore the wild and wonderful world of mushrooms and learn about the near-endless possibilities they offer, from food to fashion, cosmetics to eco-construction, and meditation to mind-altering experiences. With live music, crafts, tours, and myriad mushroom artists, artisans, and food vendors, we'll conjure the same atmosphere of pure imagination that Jefferson Airplane did when they told us to "Go ask Alice." After discovering the fascinating world of these unique organisms, we invite visitors to explore Wonderland: Curious Nature.

• Mushroom Display and Identification Table 11 a.m.-4 p.m.

Check out a wide diversity of mushrooms on display, collected by The New York Mycology Society (NYMS) and provided by local cultivators, <u>Mushroom Queens</u>. Learn some basics of mycology and mushroom identification with one of NYMS's expert identifiers. Everyone with an interest in fungi, regardless of level of knowledge, is welcome.

• Fungi for You with Hodgins Harvest

Learn about the incredible culinary and medicinal properties that fungi can offer from Aaron Hodgins Davis and his team at Hodgins Harvest. Hodgins Harvest is a certified organic mushroom farm in Rockland County, New York, growing lion's mane, cordyceps, turkey tail, and reishi for use in functional mushroom extracts and powders.

Based in the Bronx, Mi Oh My Hydroponic Farms is a worker-owned hydroponic farm and educational organization, with a mission to improve food access for the food insecure, while also providing opportunities for Black, Indigenous and people of color communities to build generational wealth using Cooperative Economics and Just Transition principles, a vision-led, unifying and place-based set of principles, processes, and practices that build economic and political power.
